

Beliefs and Authority

By the end of KS1, children should be able to:

- Talk about how Christians see God as the creator and as a loving God.
 - Name some of the early figures in the Old Testament
 - Retell and suggest meanings for stories about the birth of Jesus
- Talk about how Christians believe Jesus is special and referred to as 'The Son of God'
- Talk about and respond to questions about the life teachings of Jesus
 - Name and retell key events in the final days of Jesus ministry
 - Notice and recall how the bible is important for Christians

In KS1, learning is focused around Christianity and Islam, alongside non-religious perspectives.

 - Recall and name some of the main festivals and seasons
- Talk about how Christians see a code for living in stories from the Bible
 - Talk about how beliefs affect how Christians live their lives
